ADVANCING EDUCATIONAL EQUITY FOR 44 YEARS

After working with more than **80,000 students** across **250 colleges** over the past **44 years** and awarding **\$113 million in scholarships**, we have a clear viewpoint on what it takes to achieve student success at scale and break the cycle of generational poverty.

But today, students from low-income backgrounds are half as likely to enroll in college compared to their higher-income peers, and if they do enroll, only 11% will graduate with their bachelor's degree compared to 79% of their more affluent peers.

This **Education Opportunity Divide** between low- and high-income students is a staggering and unacceptable loss of human potential.

At 10,000 Degrees, we're changing that trajectory.

Based on our four decades of experience, we know that broad and meaningful systemic change involves giving a wider range of students expansive opportunities to succeed throughout their college journey.

Our Unbound Opportunity Model shifts the focus from limited college access to holistic college success—emphasizing whole communities, life preparedness, and wrap-around support for each student.



From 10,000 Degrees to global impact—meet a few of our alumni who are using the power of their education to become agents of change



BRENDA FIGUEROA ARELLANO

Site Director, Karma Club Owner, Dogsitters of Marin University of San Francisco, 2028 San Francisco State University, 2021 San Diego State University, 2019 "As a first-generation student raised by strong Mexican immigrant women—my mom, Ita (abuelita), and aunt, Nana—I still faced a lot of challenges. My mom was seriously injured in a car accident, and as a first-gen student, I had to navigate high school on my own.

"I was fortunate to get a scholarship to an all-girls private school for two years, which helped me prepare for honors STEM classes at San Rafael High. However, in a school with a predominantly Latinx student body, I was often the only one in my honors classes. I also played football, wrestled, and did martial arts at a school led by two women black belts.

"I met 10,000 Degrees through a high school club called College Dream Team. 10,000 Degrees was the first organization to take me on a college campus tour. That mind-blowing experience helped me envision myself as a college student and gave me the confidence to seek out resources. They also helped me overcome financial barriers by giving me their scholarship for all four years of my undergraduate degree.



I believe in the power of education because it can be liberating and empowering to those who feel like they don't have agency when they do.

"Now I'm a doctoral student studying Racial Justice in Education at USF. For my master's thesis, I interviewed 54 Latinx graduates who attended 19 Marin County high schools from 1996-2021 to understand and analyze their experiences. I've also published books on social justice issues and returned to Marin to work at a nonprofit for teens. I hope to share my research with students and inspire more first-gen students to go to college."

"I came across 10,000 Degrees in high school after my older brother applied. I saw how it helped him and knew I needed the same support. It was a perfect fit for me because my biggest dream was to go to college.

"My impact begins with community. I have seen how education changes not just an individual, but entire families, and communities, and I know that true success is collective. Personally and professionally, I want to continue building



communities in every space I enter and especially in spaces where students feel seen, valued, and supported in their educational journeys.

"My dream is for students to not only achieve their goals but to feel rooted in a community that celebrates their identities and lifts them forward, which is even more essential now with the political climate. I aim to create leaders and caregivers through the HOPE program and every space I enter because I want the students I support to go out into the world and extend the same support, compassion, and kindness to others. I want our students to continue the tradition of building strong, resilient, and caring communities, something that I was able to receive in my time in college from 10,000 Degrees that was essential to my growth as a human and as an advocate."






